Board Briefs

Board Briefs May 21, 2015

- Sunshine Chair, Lynne Brumit sent word that there had been no cards mailed since the last board meeting. The Ice Cream Social had 59 people in attendance, 23 were branch members.
- Treasurer Isabel Singleton reported a checking account balance of \$10,959.65, expenses of \$4,733.59 and income of \$12,024.07 for April. Isabel also presented the proposed budget for next year. The proposed budget could not be voted upon because we did not have a quorum, so President Michele Powell will conduct an electronic vote per our bylaws.
- Nancy Schuster made her final Home Tour report following the committee's "rap up" meeting two weeks ago. Treasurer Isabel Singleton presented the home tour budget and recommended that we have a separate account for the home tour.
- Isabel presented details on a possible Comedy Club fundraiser to be held in Volcano where AAUW could profit ten dollars for every ticket sold. She and Cathy Yochheim had conferred with Ed Tracy the manager of the Volcano Union Hotel who sponsors the monthly events. They reported feeling this could be a successful fund raiser with little extra work involved. Since no board quorum was present, president Michele will conduct an electronic vote.
- Under New Business, items addressed included the issue of not having a Home Tour Chair for next year, additions to our website, a gate being installed by the owners at our storage space, AAUW new Public Media Release Form.
- It was announced that Stephen Honeychurch's bicycling group donated \$638.00 to the scholarship in memory of Stephen, and it seemed appropriate to add that to the recipient's amount.
- It was announced that Susan Staggs had gotten a message from Kathy Andreini from AAUW State Board inquiring how our chapter got so many new members. Our branch growth has garnered attention from State and National and the info Michele provided Kathy will be shared during a panel presentation at the national convention in June 2015.
- Under Reports it was announced that our slate of nominees now include Sandee Bowman for Membership Chair and Rebecca Wilson for Newsletter Editor. Still open are home tour chair, hospitality and community representative.
- Claire Wait commented on refreshments at the Ice Cream Social and Nancy Schuster suggested that the AAUW named honoree be presented at the June annual General Meeting. Discussion followed regarding initiating of new board members and acknowledgment of outgoing board members. The meeting was adjourned at 3:05 PM

Stephen Honeychurch Memorial Scholarship

Last fall our branch established a scholarship in memory of Stephen Honeychurch. Stephen was the husband of long-time branch member, Bernice Honeychurch, and an active friend and supporter of the branch. Both Bernice and Stephen were participating contributors in Amador AAUW's successes. The Honeychurches hosted many AAUW Amador events at their lovely home in Plymouth where Stephen was a generous and enthusiastic hosting partner to Bernice.

Stephen was an obstetrician-gynecologist in the Bay Area when he unexpectedly suffered a heart attack and at that point retired early. Stephen and Bernice moved from Danville to Plymouth where they built a beautiful home in the midst of Amador County's Shenandoah wine country. Once settled in Amador County they became active in the community.

Stephen's interest in growing grapes and making fine wine flourished. He grew Viognier and Zinfandel in his vineyard and he received several awards for these and other exceptional wines.

One of Stephen's other interests was his bicycle club known as Erma's Diner. He had many close friends in the club and rode extensively and often with them. In mid-May we learned that the members of Stephen's bicycling club donated \$638 to help fund this scholarship. Our deepest thanks go to Anita Herman, Penny & Jim Gray and the all the members of the club for this generous donation.

This scholarship is funded entirely by donations. Our members and friends donated a total of \$2,000 by January 2015 and combined with the bicycle club donation that brings the total award to \$2,638.

The recipient of this scholarship is Davina Edmonson. She was born and raised in Amador County. A graduate of Argonaut High School, Davina is the first generation of her family to attend college. She received her Associate of Science from Folsom Lake College and is headed for Sacramento City College to complete her nursing degree.
